Anti-racism workshops

This term, our key stage two children participated in powerful Anti-racism workshops led by an external provider. The children explored the meaning of and different types of racism and prejudice. In addition, they explored peaceful yet powerful techniques of opposing racism and racist views. The children left the workshops both informed and equipped to navigate what sadly is still a problematic issue that in some cases that besets the progress of society.

Our key stage one children have also learnt about tolerance in their weekly assemblies this term through learning about the true meaning of racism, and how to counter racism in a respectful way, both with children and adults. They have also learnt about and explored the meaning of stereotypes and the importance of not judging others by an assumption or a preconceived idea.

With the summer holidays fast approaching, children and young people will have more free time to spend with friends, family and online.

For some, this will be spent using the internet to keep in touch with friends, catch up with the latest apps and online trends, and playing their favourite games.

Sit down together

For parents, the summer holidays are a great chance to sit down with your children. Together you can visit their favourite sites and play their favourite games, this is a great way to stay up to date with online lives and show them that you're interested in what they are doing.

The holidays are also a good opportunity to have positive conversations about the internet, so if something ever does upset your child online they would feel more confident in confiding in you. [Our conversation starters](#) are a great tool to help encourage an open dialogue with your child.

Social media and staying in touch

During the summer holidays, young people may want to keep in touch with their friends through social networking sites or games. It's a good time to ask them about what sites they use, and check any age requirements as many social media sites require users to be at least 13 years old.

- Encourage your children to use the privacy tools on the services they use, so that the content they post is only available to people they know and trust in real life. To help your children set these up, we have a guide to the privacy settings on the different sites . You can also download the UK Safer Internet Centre's safety checklists for popular sites such as Instagram, Snapchat and Facebook.

Talking about their time online

The holidays are also a good opportunity to talk to your children about their online friendships, the sites they use and encourage best practices online. Why not:

- Watch Red and Murphy talk to Freddie and Alisha about asking before they watch videos online
- Read Digiduck's Big Decision and help educate children aged 3 – 7 about how to be a good friend online
- Take the 'Be the change' quiz and help 8 – 13 year olds to explore how children and young people share images and videos online
- Have an adventure with Kara, Winston and the SMART Crew and help them to make SMART online decisions

Sharing holiday pictures

Some children may want to share photos and videos of what they are getting up to in their summer holidays online. Talk to your children about what types of photos are appropriate to share, and who they are okay to share with. Photos can hold clues that give away personal information. For example, if you share a selfie of you and friends, are there any landmarks or street signs that give away your location?

This is true for photos you might share of your children too! It's always worth asking children if they are happy with an image you want to share online. [Our Safer Internet Day research](#) found that 2 in 5 (40%) of 8-17s said that in the last year their parents or carers have posted a photo of them that embarrassed them, rising from 34% of 8-12s to 46% of 13-17s.

Holiday Activities and Food Programme

About HAF:

The Holiday Activities and Food (HAF) Programme provides free access to activities and healthy meals to eligible children and young people in Brent during the school holidays.

Children and young people can access a minimum of 4 days of HAF programme activities over the Easter and Christmas holidays, and 16 days over the summer holidays.

The programme includes:

a wide range of fun, physical and enriching activities
education around healthy eating, healthy lifestyles, and preparing food
a nutritious meal each day
signposting, referrals and support for parents, carers and families
a safe space for children to interact with others.

This programme is funded by the Government.

Who can attend

To be eligible for a free place, children and young people must currently be:

In Reception to Year 11 (inclusive); and
a resident in Brent and/or attending a Brent school; and
receiving benefits-related free school meals (FSM) or have had their eligibility confirmed by a professional.
Please note that benefits-related free school meals are separate to the universal infant free school meals (UIFSM) scheme, which provides children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 with free school meals. Pupils in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 who receive free school meals must also be eligible for benefits-related free school meals in order to access a free place on the HAF programme.

There are currently universal [free school meals](#) for all primary school children in state-funded schools for the 2023/24 academic year. This is funded through the Mayor of London.

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Year 5 School Swimming Lessons

Swimming is an important life-saving skill that encourages a healthy and active lifestyle amongst pupils. In accordance with the National Curriculum, ELPS provides swimming instruction; ELPS pupils have their swimming lessons in Year 5.

The programme of study for PE sets out the expectation that pupils should be taught to:

- Swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres
- Use a range of strokes effectively (e.g. front crawl, backstroke, breaststroke)
- Perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situations

Throughout the 2023-24 academic year, all Year 5 classes have completed their swimming lessons with 5.1 participating in swimming lessons throughout Summer Term.

Year 5 Swimming Results

All children should be able to swim by the time they are 11 years old, and ideally should be able to swim confidently over a distance of at least 25 metres. School swimming lessons are a helpful step towards achieving this, however in order for this to be accomplished for all children it is incredibly important that parents register their children for swimming lessons outside of school from as young an age as possible.

We strongly encourage parents to consider registering their children for swimming lessons starting from Reception and would highly recommend Vale Farm Sports Centre, which is very close to ELPS.
