Dear Parents and Carers,

As we come to the end of the summer term 1 and are getting increasingly closer to the end of the academic year, it is important to reflect upon all of the wonderful things that have been happening at ELPS.

Throughout the month of May, our Year 2 and Year 6 children successfully completed their KS1 and KS2 SATs. During this period, and throughout the year, our pupils have demonstrated huge effort, resilience and commitment to learning, which will hold them in good stead for their future aspirations. We look forward to receiving the results of these and hope their efforts have been justly rewarded.

There have been many enrichment opportunities happening over this past half term, which have enabled our pupils to broaden their experiences and enhance their educational experience. It has been lovely to witness our children getting creative with their new instruments, with over 50 children taking part.

It is hugely vital that our pupils read not only regularly, but also read a wide range of books. The recommended reading books provided by the school offer pupils a variety of genres and allow them to broaden their knowledge of vocabulary. It is important that pupils read as many of these books as possible in order to enrich their educational diet. It is great to see so many pupils reading these on a daily basis and in order to receive a certificate in the summer celebration assembly, pupils must continue to read as many as they can between now and then.

As summer approaches and temperatures rise, we kindly remind parents about the school's uniform policy. Children are permitted to wear a plain navy blue or black cap without any logos. Swimming Data Summary



Swimming is an important life-saving skill that encourages a healthy and active lifestyle amongst pupils. In accordance with the National Curriculum, ELPS provides swimming instruction; ELPS pupils have their swimming lessons in Year 5 and Year 6.

- The programme of study for PE sets out the expectation that pupils should be taught to:
- Swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres
- Use a range of strokes effectively (e.g. front crawl, backstroke, breaststroke)
- Perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situations

Throughout the 2022-23 academic year thus far, 5.2, 5.3, 6.2 and 6.3 have completed their swimming lessons with 5.1 and 6.1 participating in swimming lessons throughout Summer Term. The swimming results for the classes that have completed swimming lessons this year are as follows:

All children should be able to swim by the time they are 11 years old, and ideally should be able to swim confidently over a distance of at least 25 metres. School swimming lessons are a helpful step towards achieving this; however, in order for this to be accomplished for all children it is incredibly important that parents register their children for swimming lessons outside of school from as young an age as possible.

We strongly encourage parents to consider registering their children for swimming lessons starting from Reception and would highly recommend Vale Farm Sports Centre, which is very close to ELPS.
